22 artists


participated in the residency program, including

13 MT-based artists.

We facilitated 3 fiveweek Residency Sessions and placed almost \$30,000 directly into the hands of artists. All residencies were free-of-charge and we awarded stipends to every participating Artist-in-Residence.



2,000+ attendees joined us for 46 free public events, including 4 art exhibitions which drew over 1,200 attendees.



Over 200+ attended our Indigenous Initiatives speaker series which featured Indigenous artists & leaders in 4 online presentations.



We worked closely with over 2 dozen community partners to support creativity and education in Montana.



During the summer of 2022, Open AIR Artists-in-Residence Jessi Harvey (Minnesota, Composition) and Julynn Wildman (Helena, Dance) explored and experimented with new creations inspired by the Emlen Evolutionary Biology Lab. Julynn and Jessi visited with Doug Emlen and his graduate researchers to dig deep & learn about invertebrates which resulted in collaborative new works exploring the anatomy of sound and movement, which they hope to debut in the coming future!
